A social solidarity reserve

A \$100-million reserve is set up for measures to fight poverty and exclusion.

This reserve is drawn from the 2000-2001 surplus and will be used to, among other things:

- implement new social solidarity initiatives;
- meet social housing needs.

INCREASE IN SOCIAL ASSISTANCE BENEFITS (in millions of dollars)


Social assistance benefits to rise in June 2001

Benefits for individuals able to work will rise by 2.5% next June:

- increase in monthly benefits ranging from \$12 to \$23, depending on household composition;
- \$102 million more over three years.

This will benefit approximately 250 000 households.





\$32 million per year for home care services

Funding for the home help business network:

- is now provided on a permanent basis;
- is increased to \$32 million per year.


Since 1997, this support, which is of particular benefit to older persons and the needy, has helped to create:

- 103 businesses in the social economy;
- 3 800 jobs.

"Action emploi" for social assistance recipients: \$86 million over three years


Creation of a new program, "Action emploi", to encourage long-term social assistance recipients to find full-time employment.

The program will offer an employment income supplement for recipients who:

- have received social assistance benefits for at least 36 consecutive months;
- stop receiving social assistance benefits in 2002 to return to full-time employment.

INVESTMENT IN "ACTION EMPLOI" (in millions of dollars)

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


"Action emploi" – an incentive to return to work

IMPACT ON A RECIPIENT'S DISPOSABLE INCOME FIRST YEAR, 2002 (in dollars)

- An "Action emploi" recipient will receive a supplement of:
- \$390 per month the first year (about \$3 an hour);
- \$260 per month the second year (about \$2 an hour);
- \$130 per month the third year (about \$1 an hour).

With this supplement, the disposable income of a recipient working for minimum wage will be \$14 105 rather than \$10 536 without the supplement.



Note: Working 30 hours per week, \$7 an hour, \$52 weeks per year.

Other social solidarity measures

More than \$4 million for the following measures:

- \$2.6 million to support the development of businesses in the social economy through RISQ*;
- \$1.5 million for the Fonds pour l'investissement local et l'approvisionnement de fonds communautaires (Filaction).

Economic growth benefits the neediest in society

Substantial drop in the unemployment rate.

- It is now the lowest it has been in 25 years.
- Nearly 300 000 more people are working now than in 1996.






The number of social assistance recipients is down.

In 1996, 12.7% of the population received social assistance. In 2000, this proportion had fallen to 9.6%.

Compared to 1996, there are now 140 000 fewer adults and 100 000 fewer children on social assistance.
